OUR PROGRAMS

Pathway From Boys To Men, Inc. (PFBTM) assists individuals with resources to find full-time or part-time job placement, career training, housing assistance, and mentorship. PFBTM also provides support services for housing resources, and transportation assistance.

Our Careers-Quest Program (CQP) is a workforce development program designed to train, educate and build highly effective skilled workers. Careers-Quest Program is a prepreparatory program that focuses on the introduction to construction, through construction trades, apprenticeship programs, and career preparation and training as well as life skills classes.

OUR MISSION

Our mission is to provide resources and support to the underserved men, women, and youth in our community.

Our programs are designed to equip individuals with community resources and education assistance, and to increase their self-confidence -- things that are needed to live happier, healthier and more productive lives.

We have found that the paths that lead to displacement, violence, drug addictions, or imprisonment can be changed by the fellowship of successful role models.

CONGRATULATORY REMARKS



ACQUANETTA WARREN

MAYOR OF FONTANA

Acquanetta Warren was elected as the City of Fontana's first female and African American Mayor in December 2010 and re-elected in 2018. Since taking office, Mayor Warren has and continues to be a strong advocate for economic development, jobs, affordable housing, public safety, a healthier community, and fiscal integrity. Under the Mayor's stewardship, the City of Fontana was named by RentCafe the fourth Most Prosperous City in the U.S. (with a population over 100,000), as well as the Most Prosperous City in California. This acknowledgment followed the 2017 Fiscal Times' rating of Fontana as one of the financially strongest cities in the nation. From the day the Mayor was inaugurated, she has emphasized that Fontana is "Open for Business" and works directly with the Fontana Chamber of Commerce to support the needs of the business community.

This effort was rewarded in 2017 with the city being ranked fourth in California in the five-year annual growth of retail sales. During Mayor Warren's time on the City Council, there has been significant economic growth and infrastructure improvements including four reconstructed freeway interchanges resulting in reduced traffic congestion, safer streets, and ease of facilitating the movement of goods through San Bernardino County's "Inland Empire." In order to continue this economic growth, Mayor Warren began the "Mayor's Manufacturing Council," which saw more than 500 women attend the first annual Inland Empire Women in Manufacturing event. Realizing that a strong economy requires a healthy community, Ms. Warren founded the award-winning program, Healthy Fontana.

The program promotes an active community lifestyle and teaches smart nutrition choices. In 2016, the United States Conference of Mayors (USCM) named the City of Fontana the number one mid-sized city in the nation for eliminating childhood obesity. Ms. Warren has received numerous recognitions and several awards for her efforts throughout the Inland Empire, including 2017's Health Champion Award for Southern California Elected Officials from the California Center for Public Health.

A strong community also needs to feel safe. This is why public safety is among the Mayor's highest priorities. In 2013, Fontana was named one of the top 20 safest communities in the country.

Continuing to keep the community safe, the Mayor holds open conversations connecting the community with the police officers that serve to protect them so that the police officers can listen to the needs of the community. This is extremely important and helpful given the circumstances that we currently face.

A. C. GREEN

3 TIME WORLD CHAMPION

A.C. Green graduated from Oregon State with a degree in Speech Communication.

A.C. Green is a youth mentor, author, speaker, and successful businessman. He is also a role model that youth across America can respect, and for this he was recognized in the House of Representatives' Congressional Record in October 26, 1999.

His heart is dedicated to working with youth. Because of his love for young people, he established the A.C. Green Youth Foundation in 1989, with the main focus being character development.

Through his "Game Plan" character development curriculum, A.C.'s mission is to help young people build self-esteem and character and learn moral and ethical principles which will help them make responsible decisions.

A.C. Green was the Lakers' first-round selection in the 1985 college draft, 23rd selection overall. He became the first rookie since LeRoy Ellis in the 1962-63 season to appear in every game (1,192 games in all). He moved into the starting lineup in 1986-87 for the final 72 games and led the club in rebounds averaging 7.6 per game. He was selected by NBA coaches to the league's

all-defensive second team in 1988-89. He recorded a career high 35 points on January 15, 1994. A.C. was voted by his fans as a starter for the 1990 NBA All-Star Game. He earned a Championship with the Los Angeles Lakers in the 1987-1988 & 1999-2000 season.



DR. JOSHUA BECKLEY

Senior Pastor Ecclesia Christian Fellowship

Six months after becoming a Christian at the age of 16, Pastor Beckley began preaching. He accepted his call to preach at 18 years of age and later became licensed in 1976. He began to follow God's will for his life. Leaving home in October 1977 for California, he left by faith, not knowing where he would stay or whom he would meet. Pastor Beckley left because God had called him. Pastor Beckley was ordained in 1980. His education extends to a Doctorate in Ministry from The Centre for the Study of Biblical Research, a Masters in Divinity from the International School of Theology and a B.A. in Music Education. Before attending Golden Gate Theological Seminary, Pastor Beckley spent many years and many hours in self-education, learning the Greek and Hebrew languages, the disciplines of Hermeneutics, Homiletics and Exegeses. Through his dedication he has developed an extensive library of Biblical resources.

Pastor Beckley has served in full-time Christian work since 1977. He has worked with Dr. E. V. Hill at the World Christian Training Center as the Assistant Director of Activities in charge of High School Ministries. In less than one year he had Bible studies at eight of the inner city high school campuses which included Dorsey, Locke, Manual Arts, Los Angeles High, Crenshaw and Morningside.

In 1979 he came on staff at First Baptist Church of Fontana, which is now Loveland Church. He served there for twelve years as Youth Pastor, Elder, National Youth Director for Harambee, Pastor of Visitation, Executive Pastor of Discipleship Ministries, and Executive Pastor of Counseling. Over the years he wrote extensive articles for youth magazines such as "Group." Pastor Beckley also wrote the first step booklet of the Three Steps to Christian Maturity Discipleship program at Loveland, and taught Step One, Wednesday night Bible Study and periodically preached on Sundays. In 1991, the Lord gave Pastor Beckley a vision of "Picking up the Broken Pieces in the Lives of Believers" from which our current ministry was born.


Pastor Beckley is presently the senior pastor of Ecclesia Christian Fellowship and has been the pastor since it's beginning. In his current ministry, as in his past ministries, Pastor Beckley is concerned about the well-being of people from all walks of life. He dedicates his life to spreading the Gospel of Christ to all he encounters. He encourages his membership to live a life that exemplifies Christ and shows forth the love which only comes from Christ.

Pastor Beckley has received numerous awards and recognitions for his service to the Lord Jesus Christ. His present extra-ministry responsibilities are Co-founder of the Inland Empire Concerned African American Churches (I.E.C.A.A.C.), Member of the Board of Trustees for Christian Community College in Redlands; and Member of the Alliance for Education; Member of the Century Club of San Bernardino City Schools, Board Member of Community Action Partnership; also a member of several other ad-hoc committees that are geared towards changing lives and conditions for our people and our communities.

However, Pastor Beckley says his greatest accomplishments since he met Christ, are his marriage to Lynda Carol; his three wonderful children Anton, Aliea, and Anell; and his grandchildren Cameron, Jayden, David, Dominic, Christian, Lailani, Calise, Alayna, Jalen, and Eva.

Maj. Kim Anthony, the passion for serving and helping others comes with being a Mental Health Nurse. Kim started volunteering in the community and hasn't stopped. She was the President of the Inland Empire Black Nurse Association for many years and is still an active member of the Honor Society of Nursing, Sigma Theta Tau International. She has received numerous awards and certificates for her support and service in the community.

Kim is the Co-Director of the Health Ministry at the Ecclesia Christian Fellowship Church under the direction of Dr. Pastor Joshua Beckley. In December 2020, Kim tested positive for COVID-19 after traveling to Memphis, TN. After recovery, she was vaccinated and has joined Building Resilient Communities, advocating for people to receive the vaccine. "I don't want anyone to feel or go through what I went through and am still going through."

Kim's educational history speaks of her passion for learning and her dedication to the field of Mental Health. She earned her CNA License while still in high school and after graduation, she was offered a position at Patton State Hospital. She received a Psychiatric Technician License and an Associate of Science Degree from San Bernardino Valley College. During this time, she also joined the Air Force Reserve as an Aviation Management Resource Specialist. She supported the Noble Eagle/Enduring Freedom Mission while stationed at Norton Air Force Base, later transferring to March Air Reserve Base. She has traveled worldwide during her Air Force career, received many service awards, and worked her way to Master Sergeant, E7. Returning to San Bernardino Valley College, she earned a Registered Nurse Degree and began working as a Mental Health Nurse for the State of California, transferring to the Army Reserve AMEDD Nurse Corp and becoming a Psychiatric Nurse Army Officer.

As a First Lieutenant, Kim completed the AMEDD Officer Basic Course; as a Captain, she completed the AMEDD Captains Career Course; as a Major, she completed SHARP, Academy Sexual Harassment/Assault Response, and Prevention Course. During her service she received The Army Achievement Medal for Outstanding Achievement as a Psychiatric Nurse, The Army Commendation Medal for Exceptionally Meritorious Service as the Family Support Group Leader, among others. Before retirement, she was stationed in San Antonio, Texas, Garden Grove, CA. and San Diego, CA.

Continuing her education through the University of Phoenix, Kim received a Bachelor of Science in Nursing, a Public Health Degree, and Master of Science in Nursing, specialization in Nursing Health Care Education.

After retiring from Patton State Hospital after 35 years and retiring from the Army Nurse Corps after 32 years of service, Kim decided to use her MSN ED to teach Mental Health Nursing as an Adjunct Clinical Instructor at the Azusa Pacific University of Nursing.

MARCUS SALVAGE Labor Agreement Administrator Los Angeles World Airports

Marcus Savage, the youngest of six, was born on April 27th, 1967, in Los Angeles, CA. Raised in the church, his father was a Baptist Minister, and his mother was the first lady in the church, always helping in the community where there was a need. Marcus worked as a carpenter for 25 years as a member of the Carpenters Union and is currently a Project Labor Agreement Administrator for Los Angeles World Airports.

In 1992 Mr. Savage started as a Union Carpenter apprentice for Action Framing. His first union project was the Maxine Waters Employment Preparation School in Watts, California, where he grew up. His second union project was for CC Myers, Inc. who received the contract to build the 105 Freeway.

Mr. Savage became a Journeyman and Lead Carpenter in 1996 while working for CC Myers, as he continued to work for approximately 12 years. He worked in the Port of Los Angeles where he was a Pile Driver Foreman for Dutra Materials, building docks at the Port of Los Angeles over water for ships to offload their cargo. He has worked on Metro Light Rail projects, including the Greenline, Expo Line, and Blue Line. He also worked in Los Angeles retrofitting the historic and iconic Sixth Street Bridge.

In 2015 Mr. Savage was selected to be an instructor for the Carpenters Union instructing OSHA guidelines and First Aid/CPR courses to Apprentices, and conducted Journeyman retraining classes. He started a program called Brothers Keeper to help community members jump-start their union careers.

In addition, Mr. Savage obtained his General Contractors License (Savage Construction) and created a nonprofit organization called "Get In The Game, Inc." His sole mission is to educate the community on the available employment options and assist with the training necessary to attain those employment goals.

Emmett Cromwell is a Millwright Business Representative for the Southwest Regional Council of Carpenters. His career spans 24 years as a Union Millwright, 20 years working in the field, and four years working as a Millwright Business Representative. He contributes his success to his good attitude, hard work, timeliness, and dedication. He became a Millwright Journeyman in November 2001, after completing their four year apprenticeship program. Emmett now advocates on behalf of his union that learning a trade can be life changing, no longer working just a regular job; you can create a career.

Born in Mobile, AL. Emmett came to California as a young man with his family settling in Pasadena. In 1985 the family moved to Rialto, CA. wanting to guide their children way from an increasing amount of drug/gang activity that was growing in that area. Emmett finished his senior year at Bloomington High School in Rialto, CA.

After graduation he went straight into the US Navy, serving two years of active duty in Australia. When he returned to the USA, he was assigned to serve on the aircraft carrier, US Okinawa. During this time he traveled to the Philippines, Hong Kong, Singapore, and to Hawaii. Later he was transferred to the US Kitty Hawk and traveled to the Gulf War in 1993, patrolling the no-fly zone in Iraq. When his tour of duty ended, he returned to civilian life.

In 1997, after a few attempts at running a small business and being disappointed working for temp agencies for minimum wage, he took advantage of a flyer that came in the mail about becoming a carpenter. He decided on becoming a Millwright, after considering the many different types of carpentry available to him including: General Carpenter, Drywall Applicators, Acoustical Installer, Floor Layer/Worker, Insulator, Lather, Millwright, Modular Furniture Installer, Pile Driver, Plaster, Residential Carpenter, Scaffold Erector, Terrazzo Finisher, and Terrazzo Installer. He recalls being happy that all he needed was a High School Diploma, a driver's license, SSN, reliable transportation, and be ready to work an 8 to 12-hour shift seven days a week. Emmett has been a guest speaker for several of Pathway From Boys To Men's Career Quest Workshops where he shares his knowledge and advocates the benefits of finding a trade.
